While the mission of preventing, detecting and responding to public health threats requires working across disciplines and recognizing the connections between human, animal and environmental health, health professionals may find it challenging to reach out to more advanced resources outside of their existing networks. Engaging Intergovernmental Organization program provides opportunities to broaden their networks and expand their knowledge in order to maximize impact of their projects. The Southeast Asia One Health University Network (SEAOHUN)'s Engaging Intergovernmental Organization (EIO) program provides mid-career and senior professionals with meaningful networking and collaborative opportunities. Adapted from the global EIO program, this intensive professional development program allows professionals, experts and key regional leaders to meet, discuss and seed collaborations on their projects related to One Health or other global challenges.

SEAOHUN EIO encourages networking and collaboration among regional network leaders working to address complex issues of One Health. Participants draw on current events as they explore the role of intergovernmental organizations in addressing global challenges, developing international standards, creating public-private partnerships and delivering transdisciplinary capacity building.

It is anticipated that the networks formed during the program will continue to grow and expand long after the week is over, advance knowledge and effectiveness for greater One Health impact throughout the region.

At the first SEAOHUN EIO in 2016, 20 professionals from SEAOHUN member and expansion countries participated in the event in Bangkok. They returned home with growing awareness in multi-sectoral networking and collaboration as well as readiness to apply the knowledge and communication skills gained into their work.
